Report for Braybrook Parish Council.

There has been some changes to the Rural Safer Community Team over the last year. The Team are still based in Desborough but we now cover a larger area. The Safer Community Team now Cover the Kettering Rural Sector and also the Corby Rural Sector. The Corby Sector has come with extra staff which has benefited the Kettering Rural Sector.

The team are aware of the parking issues in the village and have actioned some photographs that have been sent in by contacting the registered keepers of those vehicles to advise them around how they park.

We also have a number of patrols coming up in the village over the weekend which will target this issue as raised by Members of the Public.

Braybrooke continues to have low levels of crimes. There has been a burglary reported in the village and I would ask that residents remain vigilant as to call the police for any suspicious activities in the village.

In the next month we will be in the village with cadets looking for insecure vehicles and also Houses so that we can prevent crimes from occurring. As the weather becomes nicer we always see an increase in thefts from Vehicles and Burglaries due to windows and doors being left open.

Following the serious incidents at the Green Field Site please continue to monitor the area following concerns from the residents.

We are looking to start at pilot from Desborough by having a team of four specials Constables working from the Police House. These will be dedicated to Rural Crimes and Rural issues and will increase visibility to the more Rural areas as I am aware that the visibility is the main concern in the Rural Community.

Our Rural data base of Farmer's and Landowners now has nearly 120 registered on the database and we are looking are at including the Corby area also. This is of use for making Landowners and farm owners aware of any offences or suspicious activity.

We have relaunched the Local Identified Priorities. I have attached the link to the on-line survey below and would encourage resident to use visit the site and complete the survey. Every three months we collate all the surveys together and the top three concerns along with the top three areas with those concerns become the Priorities for the team for the following three months. When I have the current ones confirmed I will contact all the councils to make them aware of these.
